	using the flash outside on a busy street, because the flash				
	can reflect the streetlights and you will				
	probably	get an	image that is o	ut of focus.	
•	Sometimes the light from the flash reflects blood vessels in				
	the eye,causing	th	em to look red	on pictures.	
	To avoid this it may be necessary to take your picture in a bright place or ask the person not to look				
	directly	at the	camera.		

•	Nothing ruins a photo more	effectively	than		
	a <u>distraction</u> in the b	ackground. You sh	nould,		
	then, be aware of yoursurrou	ndings .			
•	Occasionally it can be fun to take candid pictures. This				
	means taking photographs when you	ır subjects aren't			
	expecting it. Asking p	people to pose in			
	pictures can make them feelun	comfortable	and		
	can look artificial.				
•	Taking pictures of pets can be	difficult			
	because they don't tend to sit still. Bu	ut it is worth attem	pting		
	because the texture c	of animals' fur or t	he		
	detail on a bird's wing can look	fascinating			
	in a picture.

	family. Try to t	he type that you t	ake.		
	Maybe take a photo of them involved	I in a hobby. That	way,		
	they will look relaxed andnat	ural .
