The animals are not tr	apped in the c	rater and n	nany move in
and out freely. Because	se of the	protected	nature
of this area, and the $_$	availabili	i ty of	food and
water, most of the ani	mal pop	ulation	choose to
remain t	here all year ro	und.	
Various a	ınimals graze o	on the grass	s in the crater.
Hippos laze around in	pools during t	the	
scorching	hot days. Tl	here are	
several p	orides of lion ar	nd some of	the last
surviving black rhino i	n Tanzania.		
Groups of Maasai hav	/e traditi	onally	allowed their
cattle to graze here ar	nd they can oft	en be seen	in their
distinctive	bright clothes and		
carrying	spears, lool	king after th	neir herds of
cattle. It is said when	a lion and a M	aasai meet	face to face, it
is the lion that backs	off first.		
This whole breathtaking	ng area has a .	uniqı	ue,
almost <u>magical</u>	atmosph	nere.
